**Trackday Event Management Co Ltd**

I write to advise you that the company trading as Trackday Gift Experiences and Gift Experiences as a gift experience agent has, due to financially making a loss, now ceased trading.

The company is not able to honor any outstanding gift vouchers / invoices so I suggest that you refer any customers who may already be booked in or any future voucher holders that have not been informed that they should contact their credit card company to obtain a refund.

In the normal course of events the company might be placed into liquidation however there are no funds to do that but as a director, I will have the company struck off the register.

It is not possible to make an application for striking off until 3 months have elapsed since the company ceased trading which means that an application cannot be made until after December 2007. In the meantime it is proposed to finalise the companies returns for HM Customs & Excise and the Inland Revenue.

All creditors will be notified of the application to strike the company off. It is of course up to any creditor to present a winding up petition against the company although there will be no funds available to meet the costs of winding up or any dividend to creditors.

It would be helpful if creditors could submit to me a statement of account and I will write to you with a summary of the company's liabilities once an application is able to be made.

As the company has ceased trading it no longer has a place of trading so please forward any correspondence to;
